What are the Big Ideas Shaping the Future of the MPC?

5 Big Ideas

- 1. 500+ acre MPC's are DEAD.
- 2. Future challenges are not as much design related as they are about long term flexibility in entitlements and financing.
- 3. Future MPC's will continue to be based on pursuit of the classic village model, but implemented with fewer program elements and delivered at a smaller scale.
- The design and development model for future planned communities depends primarily on location.
 - A. "High Barrier to Entry Locations = More Innovation
 - B. "Low Barrier to Entry Locations" = Business as Usual.
- 5. Notion that the public sector will participate in the entitlement, design, financing and/or implementation of future MPC's is grounded in denial or naiveté.
